Rev. Master's address to 2nd batch at CREST, Bangalore

Excerpts from the speech made on 17th December 2006

- "...I am talking of, now, the growth of Sahaj Marg as it is wrongly spoken about, wrongly referred to. We are not trying to spread Sahaj Marg. We are trying to bring new life, offer a new life to people of the world..."
- "... until you ladies and gentlemen speak about Sahaj Marg with conviction borne out of your own feelings, experiences in Sahaj Marg, Sahaj Marg will not work. The people of your country will not receive its benefits because you are at fault, you don't speak, you know...."
- "...these Seminars are supposed to bring out this particular aspect of enabling you to appreciate in yourself, for yourself, by yourself what Sahaj Marg is, can do, and has done. Let us patiently remember this during every step of this Seminar: that it is for me to establish within myself the truths of the so-called truths that these guys have been talking about, so that I may speak this truth as my truth and not his truth..."
- "...So you have to give a chance to others to speak, to teach you so that you may teach them..."

CREST Centres are resident schools where abhyasis in batches of fifty to hundred undergo intensive training for one month. The training covers aspects of religions, spirituality, psychology and our civic responsibilities. First training took place in August 2006. Second batch joined on Dec 17th 2006 and stayed up to Dec 29.

Second Batch at CREST Bangalore



The course for the second batch of participants was conducted at CREST from 17th to 28th December. Master arrived at CREST on the 15th and inaugurated the course on the 17th. There were about fifty delegates from around the globe who came for the course, attending presentations on around 22 topics by a faculty which too had been drawn from across the globe.

The CREST course is designed to give spiritual, mental and physical rejuvenation and invigoration to all the participants. They are required to get up before 5am and do their meditation. They are encouraged to do some brisk walking and some light exercises from 6am. At 7am Group Satsangh is held in the Meditation Hall. Breakfast is served at 8 am. Presentations begin at 9am and continue till noon. Often the presentations do not get over within the morning session with lively and in-depth discussions taking place after each presentation. Then the deliberations and presentations continue in the afternoon. Otherwise the afternoon is spent in browsing the library. Delegates have to do their cleaning between 6 and 6.30 pm and dinner is served at 7.30 pm. After universal prayer at 9 pm, there is a video-show of films handpicked by Rev. Master. Of course, this

entire schedule changes if Rev. Master comes out and sits with abhyasis outside His cottage. Then this area becomes an extension of the class-room where He speaks about presentations of the day sharing His insights on various matters.

Master delivered the valedictory talk after the last presentation on 27th evening in which he spoke about communication and extolled everyone to understand the true means and value of communication. The talked marked the end of the Course and Master left



for Chennai by road the next morning. The delegates take back with them 2 weeks of encapsulated knowledge and cherished memories, which shall unfold into wonder and wisdom in their hearts and minds in the days to come.

Most of us began as strangers: 33 abhyasis from 19 countries, speaking 8 different languages, carrying with us different backgrounds and experiences. For four weeks we meditated, studied, ate, laughed, cried, shared stories and insights, discovered India and more importantly, came face to face with our inner truths as one. We were united with a common spiritual goal.

During the opening ceremony of the 2006-2007 Scholarship Training Program (STP) held on December 10, 2006, Master told us, "You are all going to receive some training here, I

hope, which will help you more and more to become human - human in the sense that we are people with hearts."

The STP has certainly been an exercise in each one of us opening our own heart, learning to listen to its subtle message, connecting with each other and deepening our own relationship with Master, who is the prime example of transforming love present in our world.

During the STP scholars had the golden opportunity to live a truly spiritual life. Through the talks given by the esteemed faculty, the group discussions and the individual reading sessions, we scholars could gain an in-depth personal understanding of the Sahaj Marg practice and its principles. Another valuable aspect of the STP was that through our experience of the simple and ideal ashram life we performed proper sadhana and developed the spirit of tolerance, work and love as brothers and sisters everyday.

Our process of transformation was complemented by the abundant beauty and harmony of nature manifested in the green and serene environment of the ashrams in Manapakkam and in Natarampally where we lived like a family. From the ashram volunteers and our STP co-ordinators, we learnt the true meaning of service - that is, selfless working and giving out of grateful devotion to Master.

One aim of the STP is that we scholars return to our homes and communities with a more disciplined practice, inner wisdom, and a desire to share the life-changing message of Sahaj Marg to other members of the human race. Master said in his speech during the closing



ceremony on January 5, 2007, "My Master used to say that it is easy to begin something, but to carry it through successfully, faithfully, with dedication and love, one needs a lot of confidence and faith in what you are doing."

It is our hope and prayer that we continue to evolve as authentic human beings with hearts that naturally overflow with love. We know that if we change, our world will change. Sahaj Marg is a way that we can begin to bring about positive change in our own small corners of the globe: to help in the work of connecting human hearts to their essence, which is the Ultimate.

VACANCIES AT Lalaji Memorial Omega International School

This prestigious co-educational school is set on a sprawling campus of nine acres. The school commenced operations on June 27, 2005 with Classes from KG to V. Enrolment was at 128. By the end of that academic year the numbers had risen to 160. The next year we received Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE), New Delhi, affiliation for Classes VI though VIII and our student population grew to 573. A hostel block was also commissioned for students V to VIII and we have about 130 boarders now. Plans for the next academic year (2007 -2008) call for about 1,000 students in Classes KG - IX (approval from CBSE is expected shortly for Class IX and X).

In the ensuing academic year (2007-08), classes are being upgraded to Class IX with hostel facilities for Students of Classes 5 to 8. We are expecting to have student strength of 1000 and this will entail an increase in the number of sections and staff (both academic and administration).

Interested candidates may register online at the earliest. Based on the need and other selection criteria, the selected candidates will be called for an interview/demonstration to be held at Chennai. 

day it was started as a medical center for treating visiting Abhyasis at Manapakkam. Its continuous operations started from July 1999. It was then decided to extend its services to the local public especially the poor. Accordingly the Free Medical Centre (FMC) has evolved and was inaugurated

The FMC has come a long way from the

by Beloved Master Shri P. Rajagopalachari on 14th Jan 2005. Primarily the FMC shall provide outpatient service and later extend to provide in-house facilities, to provide the various disciplines to a larger section of the needy and economically weaker sections by free medical aid.


FMC services are available from 10:30AM to 12:30PM daily and from 6PM to 7PM on weekdays. Monthly and weekly duties are allotted to specialists who attend to public. A team of around 20 specialists manage the specialty clinics. Beneficiaries include Manapakkam Ashram staff, LMOS staff, students, and abhyasis in addition to general public. Abhyasis and public are using the facility almost equally.

Future plans: Now four inpatient beds serve emergency cases. It is proposed to have a minimum 20 bed hospital to treat the inpatients. A full time Doctor shall be appointed in charge of the hospital on a voluntary basis or on honorarium.

Following are planned services of FMC:

- 1. Prosthodontia department to give dentures when teeth are extracted
- 2. An Ultrasound SCAN to be housed in a separate room
- 3. X ray room with a qualified x-ray technician
- 4. A pharmacist and nursing staff on permanent basis
- Infrastructure like shelves, racks, water outlets, partitions for better storage / administration
- Medical history record folders with link to patient identification cards for regular users
- Continuing medical education training by visiting doctors/faculty
- 8. 2 stand alone computers for record keeping of medical history / stocks
- 9. Medical / clinical lab with Microscope, auto analyzer for biochemical examination.
- 10. Separate room for cataract surgery





SMSF spends around one lakh rupees/month towards purchase of medicines and utilities.

Sahaj Marg Physicians Group (SMPG)

SMPG is an initiative involving physicians, medical students, residents, nurses and others in the medical community to offer medical services to the needy through SMSF Medical Centers. Revered Master has agreed tentatively to go ahead with the vision statement and plans for SMPG

AIM: To promote the well being of the people by providing primary care as well as specialist services as needed and coordinate continuity of care uniformly who utilize our clinics as a source of health care.

OBJECTIVES: To coordinate the staffing of the clinics at Satkhol and Chennai using the services of local physicians as well as other physicians in the mission who have agreed to volunteer their time at their convenience and also when a need arises to promote the well being of people using the services of our clinics. We intend to use the services from all

branches of medicine to deliver care with love and a caring attitude using a holistic approach aiming at the physical, social, and mental as well as the spiritual well being of a person.

As part of this initiative, a database of names of the physicians from all branches of medicine has been completed. A PDF data intake (demographics) form in Sahaj Marg site for physicians, medical students, residents, nurses and others to fill and be part of a central data base which can be accessed only by the designated administrators has been completed.
